

WELCOME TO Barbados PRACTICAL GUIDE







Barbados has rich English, African, and West Indian roots. A former British colony for 334 years, Barbados is now an independent nation, and part of the Lesser Antilles of the West Indies. The first indigenous people, the Arawaks, arrived from Venezuela. Later, the Carib Indians arrived in Barbados around 1200. There is still a Kalinago presence in Dominica, however, the culture of the Carib Indians has mostly vanished in Barbados.

Barbados got its name from Portuguese sailors in the early 1600's. The Portuguese named the island Los Barbados (bearded ones) after the fig trees, which looked like beards. Later in the 1600's the English colonized the island for the production of sugarcane, Tobacco, and cotton. Barbados held a dominant market share in the sugar industry in the late 1600's. The Dutch Merchants supplied slaves to meet the labor demands of the sugarcane plantations during this time. Slavery was abolished in Barbados in 1834.

Barbados gained full independence from Britain in 1966, but is still a member of the Commonwealth. Our current prime minister is Mia Mottley, the first female prime minister of Barbados

Barbadians, or Bajans, are friendly and welcoming, and have a strong religious and spiritual conscience. English is the official language of Barbados, but you'll likely hear the Bajan dialect spoken. Locals will greet you with a "Good morning" and "good evening" on the island.

Throughout your time here, you'll get to experience the traditional foods of Barbados. Flying fish and cou-cou is the national dish of Barbados. Cou-cou is similar to grits, made from cornmeal and okra. You can also try pudding and souse, a weekend lunch dish made from pork. We also recommend macaroni pie, fish cakes, and cutters (sandwiches) from local vendors and restaurants on the island.

Barbadians love a good party, or fete. <u>Crop Over</u> is the annual summer celebration, marking the end of the sugar cane harvest. Other festivals on the island include the Holetown Festival and the <u>Oistin's Fish Festival</u>. Barbados is home to Rihanna, and you can also hear Calypso and steel pan music around the island.

We hope you'll immerse yourself in the local culture and experience all that Barbados has to offer!



Statutory Functions:

- The Court Process Act—the signing of any/all Affidavits
- Under the Magistrates Court—the authority is given to issue warrants of arrest and sign as Magistrate
- Under the Barbados Citizenship Act—administer oaths in respect of application for citizenship, renunciation of Barbados citizenship
- Under the Immigration Act—certify/witness as correct, the particulars of any declaration required to be made by an applicant for Permanent Residence or Immigration Status
- Under the Bills of Sale Act—affidavits required for the purposes the Act are sworn before a Justice of the Peace

- Under the Building Societies Act—Justice of the Peace may attest to the swearing of affidavits
- In respect of applications for Barbados Passport—signing of passport photographs and application form

Safety Advice/Tips

Like anywhere else in the world, Barbados is not without crime. There are certain things you can do to stay safe and keep yourself out of harm's way.

General

- · Avoid carrying large sums of cash
- · Use Visa or debit cards where possible
- · Make copies of original documents
- · Save all emergency numbers on your cell phone
- Keep electronics, purses, backpacks, and other valuables hidden from view through home or car windows
- · Keep doors locked at all times at your home/apartment
- The wearing of camouflage clothing or the carrying of any article containing the camouflage pattern is illegal in Barbados
- Report any safety or security incidents to Ross Security immediately!

On The Beach And Sightseeing

- Marijuana is illegal, avoid persons who try to offer it or other illicit drugs to you
- · Avoid walking or frequenting lonely beaches
- Do not leave cameras, cellular phones and other valuable items unattended
- Adhere to beach signs and follow the advice of lifeguards on duty
- When sightseeing, if you're seeking help with directions, look for a police officer, a public employee (in uniform) or an official business place
- Avoid deserted/isolated areas. If you feel uneasy, leave the area.
- · Do not litter
- · Avoid picking flora or disturb wildlife
- Keep a lookout for manchineel trees, they are very poisonous.
 Standing under one during a rain shower can cause skin blisters as the sap is very acidic. These trees are marked with a red circle.
- When at public beaches, avoid holding on to ropes and buoys, as sea lice can cause skin rashes.
- · Don't give money to beggars

When Driving

- · Keep on the left side of the road
- · Avoid leaving packages in plain sight in motor vehicles
- · Lock all doors while driving
- · Follow speed limits and traffic arrows

To sum up, Barbados continues to be a generally safe place to live, visit and enjoy. This is due partly to the efforts of the members of the Royal Barbados Police Force.

We implore you to take all necessary precautions to ensure your safety and protect your personal effects as you move around enjoying all the island has to offer!

Other General Tips

- Turn your AC on right before going to bed. Turn it off as you wake up and saves on costs.
- Hang out clothes rather than using the dryer. A drying rack is a good investment!
- · Leave home before 7:00am to avoid traffic
- Massy has free transport to nearby locations once you shop there. There is a shuttle that will take you home.
- Bridgetown has duty free shopping as well as all <u>Cave</u> <u>Shepherds</u> in Barbados.
- Roads are very heavily trafficked so one needs to be cautious if they are biking.
- Although Barbados is a relatively safe island, still lock up at night
- · Don't wear camouflage, it is illegal!
- Keep your distance from the monkeys. They are beautiful creatures but they can get aggressive.
- · You cannot turn on a red light
- On a roundabout the person on the right is always correct
- Buses to city stops always get you back to a highway (or civilization)

Important Travel Tips

Being well prepared is essential for a successful move to Barbados. Some important tips include:

- Make several copies of your passport and/or visa for your personal records. It is also recommended that you copy the contents of your wallet
- Assemble all your important documents (Ross acceptance letter, plane tickets, hotel reservations, driver's license, marriage certificate, birth certificate, record/reference of prior insurance, and immunization records) and make several copies of each document
- Bring enough cash and/or traveler's checks to sustain you for two months (for rent, deposit, food, utilities, transportation and other necessities)
- Pack an extra set of clothing, medicines, laptop, and perishable items in your carry-on and personal luggage (meeting airline requirements, so that your carry-on is not taken away from you) in the event that your luggage does not arrive on the same flight as you
- Confirm your itinerary with your airline 72 hours prior to departure

Luggage

If you are bringing toiletries in your carry-on luggage, all airlines require you to pack them in a clear, quart-sized zip lock bag. Each item in the bag cannot have more than 3 oz. of fluid in it. All liquid items are required to fit in the quart-sized bag.

Small, roll-on luggage that can be checked planeside offers the most secure baggage handling, meaning you will stand the highest probability of arriving at your destination at the same time as your baggage.

Public Transportation, Taxi Services, Vehicle Rentals & Fuel

Public Transportation

You can utilize the network of public buses and ZR vans to get around the island. The cost for a one-way ticket is \$3.50 BDS, paid in Barbados cash, when you get on the bus. You'll notice signs along the roads in Barbados that mark bus stops. "Out of city" is away from Bridgetown, and "To city" is towards Bridgetown. You can learn more about the bus routes here:

ZR Vans are small white mini-buses, with a maroon stripe, and license plates start with ZR. These vans are seen often through the Oistin's to Bridgetown coast road, but are available all over the island. These are privately owned vans and are numbered 1-11 depending on the route. ZR vans are one of the quickest and unique ways to get around the island.

Taxi Services

Local taxis are readily available in Barbados, but keep in mind that this can be an expensive option for getting around the island. Taxis here do not have meters, so be sure to agree upon the price and currency before accepting a ride. Fares are regulated by the government, and you can pay with USD or BDS. However, always ask for the local rate or the cost in Barbados dollars. A good tip is to get to know one or two drivers and use them whenever you need a taxi to get better service and fares.

Rates, Fares, and Fees as is the case on many Caribbean islands, cabs are not metered on Barbados. Rates are government regulated, however, with fees hovering around \$20 USD per hour

Keep in mind that you need to also purchase a local driving permit when you rent a car, so you'll need to bring your valid driver's license with you.
